

24 Kilates Opens Shop

When Brooklyn-based artist, educator and producer Victoria Manganiello began creating woven artwork through spinning, dying and weaving her own canvases, it seemed the world paused for a moment to take notice. Using materials like synthetic and natural dyes, cotton and silk, Manganiello's work reimagines the traditional craft and explores themes of time, space and history. Created on a floor loom, her pieces will soon be exhibited as a solo show at the Java Project in Brooklyn between April and March.

The niche sneakerhead company, 24 Kilates, has recently opened the doors to its new Thailand location in the capital's Huamark neighborhood. Designed by External Reference Architects, the shop's interior evokes an exclusive treasury, filled with safes and deposit lockers. Shoes from international brands like Nike, Puma, Diadora and Adidas are arranged throughout the store's golden showroom (a nod to the brand name) and within the security boxes, inviting customers to explore the shop and find undiscovered gems. The main feature, too, follows the theme and recalls the old-school bank vaults, with the brand's logo evoking a steam punk turn-lock.
